**SUMMER PROGRAM BROCHURE** – The brochure for our summer programs has been dropped off to city schools this month and press releases have been sent to news outlets and it has been posted on social media. Registrations will begin Monday, June 3.

**KELLY CLEAN-UP DAY** – The department sponsored the Community-Wide Celebration of the Life of Charles W. Kelly on May 11 that ran from 9 a.m. to noon. Two truckloads of garbage were removed from city parks and the Maple City Trail. 75-85 volunteers took part.

**STREET TREE PLANTING** – The department held a street tree planting. We planted 18 street trees at homes that have requested trees in the right-of-way. We worked with a crew from National Grid that volunteered to help the department plant trees which cut the time it would normally take in half. Thank you to National Grid.

**FLAG BANNERS** – With help from DPW, department staff have put up all of the Hometown Heroes banners from the Pride & Beautification Commission. The banners run from City Hall to Seymour Street.

**CITY POOL** – The department filed an application that contained all required paperwork to the Department of Health for a permit to operate the Elsa M. Luksich Municipal Pool for the summer and it has been approved. Staff have begun work on cleaning and prepping the city pool to open for the summer on June 15.

**FREE ENTRY** - Pepsi Cola Ogdensburg Bottlers has announced that entry for public swimming at the city pool will be once again free this summer. This is the third season that Pepsi Cola Ogdensburg Bottlers has paid for admission for all attendees at the pool. This does not include swimming lessons, early bird swim or other programs run by the department.

**SUMMER KICK-OFF PARTY** - The department is hosting a Summer Kick-Off Party on June 21 beginning at 4 p.m. at Library Park. The department will be offering arts and crafts and there will be a wide assortment of youth games will be provided by the department, SLC Reality Check and Ogdensburg Public Library. The Ogdensburg Salvation Army will be offering bounce houses and food such as hot dogs, popcorn and snowcones.

Sometime after 8 p.m., FunFlicks will offer a free outdoor movie at the park sponsored by Enbridge St. Lawrence Gas. The exact movie will be selected several days prior to the event.
